Tembeka Ngcukaitobi is an advocate of the High Court. He holds the degrees of BProc, LLB (Unitra), LLM (Rhodes) and LLM (London School of Economics)

As an avid legal scholar, he has written extensively. In addition to several academic articles in addition to several academic articles, Ngcukaitobi has written two well-received books about land law and land reform in South Africa. *The Land Is Ours: South Africa's First Black Lawyers and the Birth of Constitutionalism* (2018) is based on several years' research and focuses on historical land dispossession under colonialism and apartheid, as well as its links to a burgeoning constitutionalism among black lawyers. *Land Matters: South Africa's Failed Reforms and the Road Ahead* (2021), which was shortlisted for the 2022 Sunday Times CNA Literary Award, sets out an argument for reforming policies on land ownership and land occupation. Ngcukaitobi has been strongly and publicly critical of the African National Congress's record in post-apartheid land reform.
